

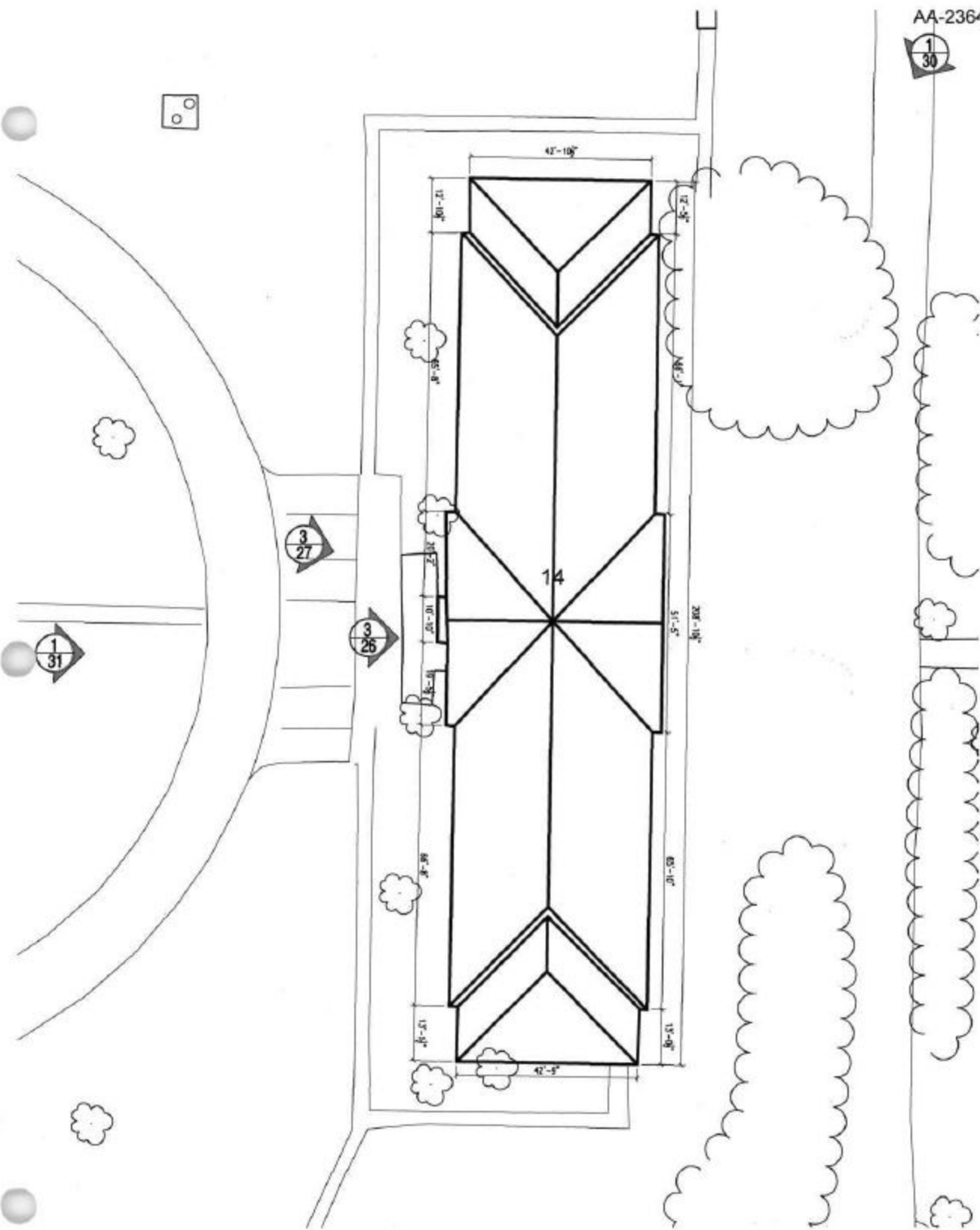
Administration Building

- **Construction began in 1938, building opened in 1940. First Lady Eleanor Roosevelt attended dedication ceremony 3/8/40.**
- **Originally called the Hospital and Administration Building housing 40 patients (38 hospital beds, 2 fracture beds, and 18 cribs, also an operating room, lab space, and a “psychiatrist’s laboratory”**
- **Originally constructed as a two story building, 3rd story added sometime in the 1950’s.**
- **30,000 Square Feet.**
- **Morgue on lower level.**
- **X-Ray room and Dentist’s Office on 2nd floor.**
- **Laboratory on 2nd floor.**
